MATCH Kids Tennis Touranment P.3 On 29th March 2023, MATCH Foundation commenced the construction of a model primary school at Mzungu village (Airwing) Lilongwe. This marked the beginning of a 4 months project funded by Rotary Club of Aschaffenburg, Germany. The school will comprise of standard 1–8 classrooms, a library, football ground, 2 Tennis courts, office building and changing rooms. The school will also be powered by solar as well as fresh water from borehole.

The Guest of honor on this day was the president of Aschaffenburg Rotary club, Dr. Michael Bargl and his wife Susanne. Other authorities present were the executive director of MATCH Foundation, T/A Njewa, the Member honorable of Parliament Ching'onga, Lilongwe Rural West Education Division Manager, GVH Mzungu and different chiefs of the surrounding area. The event was spiced up with traditional dances such as qule wamkulu, chiterera and local musical from mother groups. The school is expected to open its doors to students in September this year.

MASO PASTSOGOLO -CREATING INNOVATIVE CHANGEMAKERS



Maso Patsogolo project funded by the U.S. Embassy in Malawi strives to contribute to psycho social well-being among youths (15 years and above) through purposeful educational life skills training and sports mentoring. It is all about having a new mindset to become creative innovators to solve communities' needs.

The project is being implemented in 11 secondary schools in Lilongwe district, this last quarter the project was implemented in the following schools are Lilongwe girls Secondary School, Mkwichi and Mitundu Secondary schools. The topics among others include, goal setting, my vision board, self-assessments, as well as writing personal development plans. Mentees are equipped with knowledge about skills matching in relation to their personalities and also to identify their skills and abilities for innovative purposes.

FIRST SPELLING BEE CHALLENGE

After a successful completion of the first cohort of After-School Reading Program, management at MATCH Foundation organized its very first Spelling Bee competition. A total of 24 children qualified for the challenege. The contestants were divided into two main groups; beginner level and advanced level. At the end of it all; six children emerged as winners. From advanced group Austen Galimoto, Sten Joseph and Michael Banda became 1st, 2nd and 3rd respectively. As for the beginner group; Christina Beni, Liness Phiri and Lorent Greyson won first, second and third places. Winners went away with Shoprite shopping vouchers, reading books and coloring books with crayons. It was a colorful event and all the children got to learn how to spell words in the English Language. We look forward to another Spelling Bee for the 2nd cohort.
